

Lake Granbury Proposed Wastewater Treatment Plant Concerns and Data

This document is prepared by Granbury Fresh— an organized group of concerned homeowners and businesses who will be negatively impacted by the City of Granbury's proposed location for a new sewer plant at 3121 Old Granbury Road.

Our mission is to work with City of Granbury officials toward a positive solution that will best serve the public health interest and protect the public welfare of Hood County.

Our intent, in sharing this document, is to provide TCEQ and the City of Granbury with additional data and facts, to encourage City officials to withdraw the current TCEQ discharge permit application, and instead pursue a permit for a sewer plant located where the facility will do the least harm, in a less developed area. Further, we encourage the City of Granbury to consider developing a wastewater solution in keeping with the adopted *Lake Granbury Watershed Protection Plan* (only the second WPP from Texas to be adopted by the US Environmental Protection Agency), and to consider applying for a Texas Land Application (TLAP) permit, rather than discharging treated wastewater into any body of water. The current proposed sewer plant location **will pose significant risks** to the overall economy of Hood County, the environment, and to schools, parks, prime farmland, historical sites, and to the health and quality of life of hundreds of citizens in proximity to the proposed plant.

Please consider working with us to develop a wastewater treatment solution for the greater Hood County area, in way that will leave this community better than we found it.
